This party has been in the planning for quite some time ... 500 years to be exact! On October 31st the world will celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. Why October 31st? Because on October 31, 1517, Martin Luther posted the "95 Theses" on the doors of the Wittenberg Castle Church in Germany. He chose that date because he knew the pews would be packed on the next day for All Saint's Day.

The tone of the theses was humble and academic. He was questioning some of the practices of his church rather than accusing. Through the reading of scripture, he came to the conclusion that salvation could be reached only through faith and by divine grace alone. This led him to object, on principle, to the corrupt practice of selling indulgences. Luther intended to reform the Roman Catholic Church, but that was not to be. Luther was eventually excommunicated and with that the Protestant Reformation became the stuff of history.

Fast forward 500 years! How things have changed! While the church is still divided, we are working to build bridges all the time. If you had told Martin Luther, at the time of his death, that the Pope would participate in a prayer service that would kick off the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, he would have told you that you were out of your mind. And yet, that is exactly what happened! On October 31, 2016, Pope Francis traveled to Sweden, a primarily Lutheran country, and participated in a joint ecumenical prayer service at Lund Cathedral with representatives from the Church of Sweden and the Lutheran World Federation. During the service the Pope said, "We have the opportunity to mend a critical moment of our history by moving beyond the controversies and disagreements that have often prevented us from understanding one another." He even went as far as to praise Martin Luther – once deemed a heretic by the Roman Catholic Church – as a great reformer.

Here at Good Shepherd we will mark the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation as well! Please mark your calendars ...

Sunday, September 10th from 9:45am – 10:45am, Steve Seyfried will be with us to present "Luther 500, A Layman's Guide to the Protestant Reformation." Steve is both an actor and playwright. The presentation will be lively, informative, and entertaining.

Saturday, October 21st from 9:30am – 2pm at Trinity Lutheran Church in Lansdale, you are invited to "1517 – 2017, From Conflict to Communion – Together in Hope." In the morning you are invited to a seminar, we will break for lunch and then conclude the day by worshipping together following a Service of Repentance and Reconciliation. The Rev. Dr. Peter Donahue, President of Villanova University (an Augustinian priest like Martin Luther) will be the preacher and our Bishop, Claire Burkat, will be the liturgist. Some of you who heard Father Peter preach at one of our midweek Lenten services a number of years ago know what a dynamic preacher he is!

Sunday, October 29th at 8:30am and 11am we will celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation at Good Shepherd. At 11am, four of our youth will confirm their faith.

Details regarding the above events can be found in this newsletter. Please plan and join us as we celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, but more importantly, celebrate that Christ continues, even today, to reform the church.





Development Services as well as in a local preschool.

In Kabul, 2007, with a drug-addicted father and no brothers, Rahima and her sisters can only sporadically attend school, and can rarely leave the house. Their only hope lies in the ancient custom of bacha posh, which allows young Rahima to dress and be treated as a boy until she is of marriageable age. As a son, she can attend school, go to the market, and chaperone her older sisters.

But Rahima is not the first in her family to adopt this unusual custom. A century earlier, her great-great grandmother, Shekiba, left orphaned by an epidemic, saved herself and built a new life the same way.

Crisscrossing in time, The Pearl That Broke Its Shell interweaves the tales of these two women separated by a century who share similar destinies. But what will happen once Rahima is of marriageable age? Will Shekiba always live as a man? And if Rahima cannot adapt to life as a bride, how will she survive?

SEPTEMBER OU'TREACH—Lutheran Disaster Response is an ELCA organization that supports case management primarily through local providers like Lutheran Social Services. They bring God's hope, healing and renewal to people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters. **September's Outreach collection will be designated to help the victims of Hurricane Harvey.** *Checks may be made payable to Good Shepherd and designated for "Outreach".*

OCTOBER OUTREACH —The government of Rwanda decreed that all Rwandan children are to be raised as "true Rwandans," and as such all orphanages were to be shuttered by the end of 2015. Most of the Nibakure village children were returned to the homes from which they were removed. These former residents of the village need much support; the government program, as currently run, is unable to provide even their most basic needs.

Funds from Good Shepherd were used to bring 18 children back to the village for a New Year celebration at the end of 2016, as well as provide them with every day necessities, including towels, toothbrushes, bath slippers, shoes, pajamas, underwear, and clothing.

At the beginning of 2017, the Nibakure village transitioned and is now known as the **"Nibakure Community Village"** (NCV). The current focus is on providing much needed education to children, women, and families in the local area.

A group from Good Shepherd will be visiting the NCV during the summer of 2018. We would like to bring the original residents back to the village for another reunion, support the current operations, and provide much needed love and support from abroad.



- If this is the first time you have accessed Amazon Smile, an Amazon Smile promotional screen will be displayed. (If you have used Amazon Smile previously and have selected a different non profit, click on Your Account from the top menu and select Change Your Charity from the dropdown, or select Change Your Charity from the Settings section on the Your Account page.)

- In the box titled "Or pick your own charitable organization:", enter Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd Kng of Prussa. Enter it exactly as shown here, including the misspelling of the town.

- You should see one search result, showing our church as you entered it. Press the <u>Select</u> button opposite this entry in the list.

- That's all you need to do. From this point on, as long as you use the smile.amazon.com link, then the website and its services will be the same, but Amazon is diverting the 0.5% funds to Good Shepherd for every purchase.

- If you have a bookmark in your browser for Amazon.com, remember to change it to smile.amazon.com.

Good Shepherd continues to participate in the Shop With Scrip gift card program. The revenue has enabled the church to participate in additional programs and make purchases that are not included in the annual budget. In 2016 we were able to renovate the "sprinkler room" as office area for our Vicar, Rachel Scheible





The process is simple. You can request any of the gift cards at any time, however, gift card orders are placed on the first Sunday of each month. (To view a complete list of retailers who participate in this program, visit ShopWithScrip.com via the internet). Write a check payable to Good Shepherd for the total amount of the face value of the cards and place your order and check in the offering plate clearly marked "gift card order". There are also order forms available in the file drawer of the credenza in the mail slot labeled "Gift Cards". The cards will be available on the second Sunday of each month. A percentage of the sale will benefit Good Shepherd and the percentages range from 1% to 20% depending on the retailer you select. At the end of the year you will receive a statement with a total of all the rebates from the cards you have purchased in 2017 and that amount can be used as a deduction on your 2017 income tax if you itemize.

LUTHERANS and CATHOLICS TO MARK REFORMATION ANNIVERSARY



Lutherans and Catholics will mark the **500th Anniversary of the Reformation** with an ecumenical seminar and worship on **Saturday, October 21**st, from **9:30am to 2pm** at **Trinity Lutheran Church in Lansdale**.

The event – 1517-2017, From Conflict to Communion – Together in Hope – features a seminar highlighting the common commemoration between Lutherans and Catholics for this anniversary. The Rev. Donald McCoid, Bishop Emeritus of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod, and Dr. John Borelli of Georgetown University will lift up the significant theological progress promoting recent movement toward unity in Christ between Lutherans and Catholics.

Bishop Emeritus McCoid served as the Executive for Ecumenical and Inter-Religious Relations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) from 2008-2016. He served as the Bishop of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod from 1987 until 2007.

A renowned Catholic theologian, Dr. Borelli is Special Assistant for Catholic Identity and Dialogue to President John J. DeGioia of Georgetown University. He is also the Coordinator for Dialogue and Relations for the Jesuit Conference of the United States and Canada.

After lunch we will worship together following the Service of Repentance and Reconciliation held in October 2016 led by Pope Francis and Bishop Munib Younan, President of the Lutheran World Federation in Lund, Sweden.

The Rev. Dr. Peter Donahue, President of Villanova University and an Augustinian priest (like Martin Luther), will be the preacher. **Bishop Claire Burkat** will be the liturgist, along with lay and clergy participants.
