I am writing this pastoral letter on the morning after our 60th Anniversary celebration. It was a grand occasion indeed! As the years go by and people reflect on our ministry up here on the hill, I have no doubt that this day will stand out as one of the highlights of our life together. How wonderful it was to welcome back Pastor Greg Wenhold and Idalynn along with so many other saints who have been part of Good Shepherd's past. And it was good to have our newer members with us as well, as they learned about our past and help us to stay focused on where we are headed.

As many of you know, when I was officially called to be your pastor, I was granted a 3 month, summer sabbatical after five years of service. Well, the time was not right for me to go after 5 or 6 years, but now, after 7 years of serving as your pastor, the time is right.

The word "Sabbatical" comes from the word "Sabbath," a time for holy rest. This August I will have completed 26 years of ordained ministry and have never had a sabbatical. I love ministry and hope to serve for many years to come. I have no doubt that this 3 month sabbatical will be just the thing to reenergize me!

In addition to time at home, I will be doing quite a bit of traveling. I will go to Medellin, Columbia; Red Oak, Iowa; Paradise Falls, Cresco, Pennsylvania; The Chautauqua Institution, Chautauqua, New York; Seattle, Washington; Holden Village, Washington; and Long Beach Island, New Jersey. I hope to spend time reconnecting with friends and family in addition to time resting, reading, laughing, playing, and praying. Those of you who are on Facebook can keep up with my adventures there.

What is the plan for coverage?

There are a wide range of pastors who are coming to preach while I am away. Some of them you know and some of them will be new to you. Please come as often as you can to support the ongoing ministry and mission of the church and be sure to welcome our visitors with the warmth and hospitality for which Good Shepherd is known.

Vicar Rachel Scheible along with Pastor John Kerr and Janice Rackovan, our Parish Nurse and head of Lydia visitors, will be providing pastoral care. Rest assured, you are in very good hands.

Vicar Rachel and Pastor Kerr will be conducting funerals while I am away. If you would like to schedule a baptism or a wedding, please contact me when I return in August. I will not be doing any scheduling while on sabbatical.

I will not be answering email while I'm away and ask that you wait to email me until I return. I would prefer not to come back to a "full email box." Vicar Rachel or the Church Council President, Bill Loane, will be able to contact me if there is an emergency.

I pray that you will all have a restful and rejuvenating summer. I will miss you all and I look forward to catching up when I return.

MESSAGE FROM VICAR RACHEL

Music is the art of the prophets and the gift of God. — Martin Luther, reformer and theologian

Dear Friends,

I have the delight of five beautiful daughters. We have lots of laughs and good times together. But like any family, we have some “migraine” moments too. Quite honestly, one of my “migraine” moments is due to music. I tend to be pretty easy going with the girls, when we are in route by car the radio is always playing their music. For the most part I can enjoy their music, and that is mainly due to the philosophy of “sharing” the radio. Each of the girls have their favorite songs and music genre. My eldest daughter prefers classical chorus numbers, the 15yr old and 12 yr. old are taken with the current new releases, the youngest two prefer Disney hits. In an attempt to keep peace, we alternate between styles. The other day I overheard the nine year old ask her sister if the song she had picked was her song. “Yeah” she replied, “that’s my song”. As I listened closer to the lyrics, I learned more about my daughter and of her feelings.

I listen to her songs, each of the girl’s songs, because I love them. A “loved” song tells us some things about the person, what they are experiencing, or of their memories past. As brothers and sisters in Christ, on Sunday mornings, we gather with singing. Hopefully we are singing a variety of music, because God has made us all unique creations. I imagine each of us have a “favorite” song. Each of us has a song we hold close to our heart, one that we never tire of singing. Maybe “your song” is an old traditional, such as *O God, Our Help In Ages Past*, or *Amazing Grace*. Perhaps it is a newer composition such as *Breathe*, or a praise song from a different culture, such as *Siyahamba*. Whatever it may be, we give thanks to God for giving us a variety of music.




FLEA MARKET & BAKE SALE


MARK YOUR CALENDAR! Saturday, September 30th






Monday, June 26th—*The Storied Life of A.J. Fikry* — by Gabrielle Zevin

A.J. Fikry's life is not at all what he expected it to be. His wife has died, his bookstore is experiencing the worst sales in its history, and now his prized possession, a rare collection of Poe poems, has been stolen. Slowly but surely, he is isolating himself from all the people of Alice Island—from Lambiase, the well-intentioned police officer who's always felt kindly toward Fikry; from Ismay, his sister-in-law who is hell-bent on saving him from his dreary self; from Amelia, the lovely and idealistic (if eccentric) Knightley Press sales rep who keeps on taking the ferry over to Alice Island, refusing to be deterred by A.J.'s bad attitude. Even the books in his store have stopped holding pleasure for him. These days, A.J. can only see them as a sign of a world that is changing too rapidly. A small package arrives at the bookstore and the plot thickens. This tale is as surprising as it is moving, *The Storied Life of A. J. Fikry* is an unforgettable tale of transformation and second chances, an irresistible affirmation of why we read, and why we love.

Wednesday, August 2nd—*Born a Crime* — by Trevor Noah

Trevor Noah's unlikely path from apartheid South Africa to the desk of *The Daily Show* began with a criminal act: his birth. Trevor was born to a white Swiss father and a black Xhosa mother at a time when such a union was punishable by five years in prison. Living proof of his parents' indiscretion, Trevor was kept mostly indoors for the earliest years of his life, bound by the extreme and often absurd measures his mother took to hide him from a government that could, at any moment, steal him away. Finally liberated by the end of South Africa's tyrannical white rule, Trevor and his mother set forth on a grand adventure, living openly and freely and embracing the opportunities won by a centuries-long struggle.

We cook casseroles and provide bag lunches to Face to Face in Germantown six times per year. However, they are more than just a soup kitchen. They offer dignity, compassion and a sense of community to more than 2,500 low income and homeless individuals each year. In addition to the Dining Room they offer a nurse managed Health Center, a Social Services Center, a Legal Center, a Neighborhood Arts Studio and a Summer Camp program.






Dear Pastor DeWerth:

The text can be as long as three lines with 18 characters (including spaces) on each line. Both upper and lower case letters can be used. There will be a dedication of the redesigned outdoor sanctuary on Rally Day, September 10th. All bricks ordered by August 1st will be included in the dedication.


