HOST FAMILIES: for the 4 counselors to provide a bed, shower, and breakfast daily, from Sunday evening 7/10 through Friday morning 7/15.


As in the past, we will be posting a wish list for snacks, food, and supplies once we are closer to the big week. Please watch the bulletin and email blasts for additional information!

Showing Wednesday, August 17th—*Prison Terminal: The Last Days of Private Jack Hall*


(2014) PG-13 (Running time—114 minutes) This moving 2014 Oscar Nominated film is a moving documentary that breaks through the walls of one of America's oldest maximum security prisons to tell the story of the final months in the life of a terminally ill prisoner and the hospice volunteers, they themselves prisoners, who care for him. The film draws from footage shot over a six-month period behind the walls of the Iowa State Penitentiary and provides a fascinating and often poignant account of how the hospice experience can profoundly touch even the forsaken lives of the incarcerated.

Wednesday, July 20th—*Can't Wait to Get to Heaven* —By Fannie Flagg

Life is the strangest thing. One minute, Mrs. Elner Shimfissle is up in her tree, picking figs, and the next thing she knows, she is off on an adventure she never dreamed of, running into people she never in a million years expected to meet. Meanwhile, back home, Elner's nervous, high-strung niece Norma faints and winds up in bed with a cold rag on her head; Elner's neighbor Verbena rushes immediately to the Bible; her truck driver friend, Luther Griggs, runs his eighteen-wheeler into a ditch—and the entire town is thrown for a loop and left wondering, "What is life all about, anyway?" Except for Tot Whooten, who owns Tot's Tell It Like It Is Beauty Shop. Her main concern is that the end of the world might come before she can collect her social security. In this comedy-mystery, those near and dear to Elner discover something wonderful: Heaven is actually right here, right now, with people you love, neighbors you help, friendships you keep. *Can't Wait to Get to Heaven* is proof once more that Fannie Flagg "was put on this earth to write" (Southern Living), spinning tales as sweet and refreshing as iced tea on a summer day, with a little extra kick thrown in.




Monday August 29th—*All the Light We Cannot See*—By Anthony Doerr


This beautiful, Pulitzer Prize winning *New York Times* bestseller is about a blind French girl and a German boy whose paths collide in occupied France as both try to survive the devastation of World War II.

Marie-Laure lives with her father in Paris near the Museum of Natural History, where he works as the master of its thousands of locks. When she is six, Marie-Laure goes blind and her father builds a perfect miniature of their neighborhood so she can memorize it by touch and navigate her way home. When she is twelve, the Nazis occupy Paris and father and daughter flee to the walled citadel of Saint-Malo, where Marie-Laure's reclusive great-uncle lives in a tall house by the sea. With them they carry what might be the museum's most valuable and dangerous jewel.

In a mining town in Germany, the orphan Werner grows up with his younger sister, enchanted by a crude radio they find. Werner becomes an expert at building and fixing these crucial new instruments, a talent that wins him a place at a brutal academy for Hitler Youth, then a special assignment to track the resistance. More and more aware of the human cost of his intelligence, Werner travels through the heart of the war and, finally, into Saint-Malo, where his story and Marie-Laure's converge.



JUNE OUTREACH



This July, 85 teenagers, young adults, and adults from 18 of our synod's congregations will travel to the Rosebud Reservation in South Dakota to work with the Lakota people. Rosebud is located in the third poorest county in the nation, and the work we do there makes an incredible impact on the people we serve. Through this trip, which has run every three years since 2004, SEPA youth, young adults and adults learn to see beyond themselves and deepen their relationships with God. A full scholarship to send a youth unable to afford the trip on this powerful experience is \$925. Your support of this project ensures that they can offer the same powerful opportunities for service and spiritual formation to all youth in our synod, regardless of financial situation. Pastor Bradley Burke will be our guest preacher on June 12 and will share more information about this project. The Rev. Bradley R. CASSEROLE DAY—Saturdays— May 14th and July 23rd Help Needed to Feed the Hungry




CONTINUE TO "LIKE" US ON FACEBOOK!



There is street and lot parking available. Limited parking is available behind the church, entrance on W. Chestnut St. A larger lot is across the street from the church, entrance on S. 4th St. across from Perkasio Mennonite Church. Space is reserved by the church's front entrance on S. 5th St. for handicapped drop-off.

Information on Required Background Checks

In 2014 Pennsylvania enacted legislation to strengthen the protection of the Commonwealth's children with more stringent criminal background check requirements for those who work with children and youth.

Under Pennsylvania law all church employees and volunteers who work with children and youth (age 18 and younger) must have current background checks. Checks must be updated every 60 months.

Congregations must ensure that staff and volunteers have the proper clearances and keep the background checks on file at the church. For volunteers who were in place prior to August 25, 2015, **checks must be current by July 1, 2016**. New volunteers approved after July 1, 2015 must have current clearances before serving.

In addition, the law classifies clergy and all paid staff and volunteers who work with children and youth in any capacity as "mandated reporters" who must directly report suspected abuse to child welfare officials. "Mandated reporters" can no longer discharge their responsibility by reporting to a supervisor. Willful failure to report suspected child abuse can result in misdemeanor or felony charges, depending on the severity of the alleged abuse.
