Brothers and Sisters,

This year the season of Lent is bookended by two secular holidays. Ash Wednesday was on Valentine's Day, a day devoted to love and schmaltz. Easter will fall on April Fools' Day, a day devoted to trickery and practical jokes. It's a quirky calendar coincidence that hasn't happened in decades.

April Fools' Day is all about presenting information that is on the edge of believability. The trick is to get someone to believe an outlandish claim that seems out of this world and then, when the person accepts it as truth, they are called a fool (all in good fun, of course!). They are told it's all been a prank ... a made-up story ... a practical joke.

Holy Week seems full of information that is over the edge of believability ... a king riding on a donkey? How about an angry mob demanding that Jesus be crucified when he has committed no crime? God hanging on a cross? It all seems beyond believable ... part of one big joke. But it isn't a joke.

And then, on Easter Sunday, when Jesus emerges from the tomb after being there for three days and the women run to tell the disciples that he is alive, the men think it is a prank but not a very funny one. But they soon learn that it isn't a joke ... or a prank ... or even an idle tale. Jesus is alive!

The only April Fools' joke being played on that first Easter morning was played by Jesus and he was playing it on the devil and those who thought they could kill him.

I pray that you are having a wonderful Lent. Our midweek soup suppers and worship have been glorious so far. If you have not joined us, please do. And if you have been coming, please keep coming. And then walk with us through Holy Week. Come as we follow Jesus into Jerusalem amidst shouts of Hosanna and share in the Last Supper that Jesus ate with his disciples on Maundy Thursday. On Good Friday, come and worship with us as we contemplate Christ's great love for us. And then, on Easter morning, come and celebrate! Come for what promises to be a delicious Easter Brunch. Come to worship and shout out the "A" word that will have been buried deep in our hearts for 40 days. Be part of the excitement as our children release the "A" balloon from the box and watch it drift up to the cupola, where we hope it will remain for the 50 days of Easter. But most importantly, come and worship the one who played the greatest April Fools' joke of all ... Jesus Christ our Lord.

MTMA is committed to supporting its students through the 12th grade with tuition, basic healthcare, and tutoring. The Academy's model has been proven successful and is being implemented in 30+ schools across Liberia and throughout Africa. It pays for one year of schooling, uniforms, medical care, psychosocial case, family planning, access to technology and two hot meals a day for one.

#### MAY OUTREACH—BABY MANNA

Each year 12,000 babies are born into poverty in southeast Pennsyvania. Many of these infants are reared by caregivers who are unable to nurse. Tragically, during the first year, many caregivers are unable to afford infant formula and resort to diluting formula with water, introducing cow's milk too early, or starting babies on solid foods prematurely. Consequences of this type of malnutrition are often devastating and permanent, affecting the babies' physical, mental and social growth. 100% of the money received from the annual Baby Manna collection is used by Philabundance to purchase infant formula and baby food. Baby Manna raises funds to purchase infant formula and baby food for babies born into poverty in our five county Philadelphia area.

### Message from Vicar Rachel

The other day my young daughter finished eating up her Valentine candy, which was heading to be a disappointing moment! But her older sister informed her "in a few days we will have baskets full of Easter candy!" Their conversation then turned to which Easter candy is their favorite, and ended declaring which color jelly bean they always pick first to eat. Easter season always incorporates tons of jelly beans, and their vibrant colors

Colors can tell us a lot. If the sky is dark you know that a storm is coming. If a person looks pale they may not be feeling very well. If a burner on a stove is red it may be hot. Colors can also be used to tell us a story. I found this tidbit and considered it a good share as we prepare for Easter time. The jelly bean colors remind us of the greatest story of all time, Jesus, and His love for us.

Black: Because of the sin we are born with and the wrongs we do, we separate ourselves from God (Psalm 51:5, Ephesians 2:1, Romans 6:23a). Red: Reminds us of the blood Jesus shed on the cross for all of our sin (John 19:34, Romans 5:9). White: Because of Jesus' death and rising from the dead we are forgiven and are no longer separated from God (Isaiah 1:18, Psalm 103:1-12, Romans 8:31-39). Blue: Reminds us of the waters of baptism which with God's Word brings forgiveness and eternal life (Acts 2:38, Mark 16:16, Romans 6:3-5). Green: This is the color of life. Because of Jesus we have new life promised to us (John 3:16, Romans 6:4). Yellow: The color of heavenly glory. Because of Jesus we will be given a place in heavenly glory where the streets are paved in gold (Philippians 3:20-21, Revelation 21:21).




