Silver Springs Children's Choir Will Be Singing for us on September 9th



The children served by the Residential Treatment Program at Silver Springs – Martin Luther School have come to us in need of healing and nurturing. They are boys and girls between the ages of six and fourteen and most have experienced traumas that might include physical abuse or sexual abuse, abandonment, or neglect. Many of the children have witnessed domestic violence and been affected by parental mental illness, the effects of poverty, and other very challenging situa-



tions. Our program helps children to heal from the emotional aftermath of these experiences and improve their ability to manage their feelings and behaviors. We also provide the children with oppor-

tunities to experience childhood joy.

The children's gospel choir is one of these opportunities. Since its inception, more than 100 children have participated in the choir. They have performed at several churches, Silver Springs' events, and twice at the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod Assembly. A highlight for the children was performing during the Thanksgiving Day Parade in Philadelphia last year! Their joy is obvious in their smiles when they sing and each performance has had listeners enthusiastically clapping and singing along!

We are grateful to Good Shepherd Lutheran Church for your caring partnership in the ministry of Silver Springs and for your support of our children's choir. Thanks to all of you, we are able to bring the healing powers of music to "our" boys and girls!

Amanda Bryant joined the Development Office at Silver Springs – Martin Luther School in 2014 and is an integral member of the department that is responsible for fundraising and friend-raising activities to support the ministry of Silver Springs. As Development Officer, along with providing overall support for the Development Office activities, Amanda's primary responsibilities are coordinating volunteers, managing donations of items for the children and families we serve (gifts in kind), as well as outreach and engagement with congregations. Each year Good Shepherd provides 100 gifts to the children.
