Dear Brothers and Sisters,

For many people the first weeks in December are merely a “pre-Christmas” time filled with parties, shopping, and the decking of the halls. But for the church, this is the season of Advent ... a time of preparation for the birth of Christ.

This penitential season is set in the dramatic struggle between light and darkness. During these early days of December, the darkness deepens and the days grow shorter. For those of us who live in modern times, the drama is less obvious. It is little more than an annoyance as we switch on the lights in the late afternoon. But think of those who lived before us, before electric lighting. Perhaps it was possible to huddle near a candle, oil lamp, or fire, but the darkness put a stop to most things. Work, reading, and most forms of recreation could not take place after dark. Darkness was a significant impediment, but also an opportunity to live life differently. There was certainly more time for thinking and reflection.

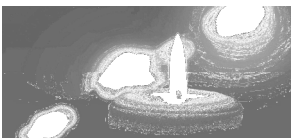
And so here, in the deep and dark days of December the light continues to recede. The spiritual impact of this drama of light and darkness is brought into the church. The darker it gets, the more candles we light on the Advent wreath. And as we light the candles, we sing hymns that speak of the light that will come: Jesus, the true Light of the World. In the darkest days of December, our Advent wreath is at its brightest. As scripture says, “The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.” (John 1:5)

And then, on December 24th, at midnight, in the deepest darkness, the brightest of all stars appears and hangs over the stable in Bethlehem. Christ is born and the true light, the light for which we have waited and longed for, comes into the world!

Yes, the great drama of light is unfolding before us. Come and worship with us during these dark days of Advent. Come and watch and wait with us for the light of Christ.

ALTAR FLOWERS and CHURCH BULLETINS



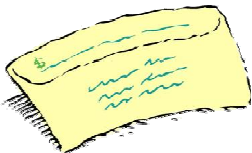

For the Women of Good Shepherd and their Friends

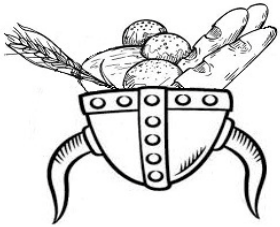
March 29-30, 2019
