Dear Brothers and Sisters,

A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. (Isaiah 2:1)

Our focus is often drawn to the large and dramatic. At this time of the year, we gaze at the big Christmas Tree in Rockefeller Plaza, the blinding display of Christmas lights in our neighbors' yards and to the big guy in the red suit bellowing "Ho! Ho!"

But during this season of Advent, scripture is trying to pull our attention away from the large and obvious and urging us to fix our gaze on the small and subtle. It feels counterintuitive but it is not in the big that we find our hope. It is in the small. It's true. God, who is the creator of our vast universe, comes to us in the small and vulnerable. But if you have your eyes fixed on shiny things, you may miss it altogether.

During these dark December days we hear the words of Isaiah ringing out, "A shoot shall come out of the stump of Jesse." From the seemingly dead, decayed stump, life will spring forth. Dare to look for life amongst the dead. You may find yourself surprised!

During the four Sundays of Advent we will light the candles on the Advent wreath. First one, then two, three, and four. The candles are small but in faith we believe that they are bright enough to pierce the darkness of our world. Hope is not found in the garish Christmas light displays, but in a single candle on the simple, evergreen wreath.

On Christmas, we will again dare to stoop down and look into the manger. In the quiet of the night, far from the mall and the 24 hour Christmas music that is piped into almost every place we go, we will see the babe of Bethlehem wrapped in swaddling clothes, born to a teenage mother in the cold dark night. God comes to us in the small, tender and vulnerable. It is in Him that we place our hope.

During this season of Advent keep your eyes focused on the shoot that springs from the stump and on the single candle that pierces the darkness. But most importantly, keep your eye on the babe born in the manger for it is in Him that we find our hope.

ALTAR FLOWERS and CHURCH BULLETINS




WINTER BOOK CLUBS at GOOD SHEPHERD (7:00PM in the church library)



Tuesday, January 28, 2020 — A Well Behaved Woman A novel of the Vanderbilts by Therese Anne Fowler

Alva Smith, her southern family destitute after the Civil War, married into one of America's great Gilded Age dynasties: the newly wealthy but socially shunned Vanderbilts. Ignored by New York's old-money circles and determined to win respect, she designed and built 9 mansions, hosted grand balls, and arranged for her daughter to marry a duke. But Alva also defied convention for women of her time, asserting power within her marriage and becoming a leader in the women's suffrage movement.


With a nod to Jane Austen and Edith Wharton, Therese Anne Fowler paints a glittering world of enormous wealth contrasted against desperate poverty, of social ambition and social scorn, of friendship and betrayal, and an unforgettable story of a remarkable woman. Meet Alva Smith Vanderbilt Belmont, living proof that history is made by those who know the rules—and how to break them.



Monday, February 24, 2020 — An American Marriage by Tayari Jones

Newlyweds Celestial and Roy are the embodiment of both the American Dream and the New South. He is a young executive, and she is an artist on the brink of an exciting career. But as they settle into the routine of their life together, they are ripped apart by circumstances neither could have imagined. Roy is arrested and sentenced to twelve years for a crime Celestial knows he didn't commit. Though fiercely independent, Celestial finds herself bereft and unmoored, taking comfort in Andre, her childhood friend, and best man at their wedding. As Roy's time in prison passes, she is unable to hold on to the love that has been her center. After five years, Roy's conviction is sud-

denly overturned, and he returns to Atlanta ready to resume their life together. This stirring love story is a profoundly insightful look into the hearts and minds of three people who are at once bound and separated by forces beyond their control. An American Marriage is a masterpiece of storytelling, an intimate look deep into the souls of people who must reckon with the past while moving forward--with hope and pain--into the future.



Monday, March 30, 2020 — The Giver of Stars by Jojo Moyes

Set in Depression-era America, a breathtaking story of five extraordinary women and their remarkable journey through the mountains of Kentucky and beyond, from the author of *Me Before You* and *The Peacock Emporium*.

Alice Wright marries handsome American Bennett Van Cleve hoping to escape her stifling life in England. But small-town Kentucky quickly proves equally claustrophobic, especially living alongside her overbearing father-in-law. So when a call goes out for a team of women

to deliver books as part of Eleanor Roosevelt's new traveling library, Alice signs on enthusiastically.

The leader, and soon Alice's greatest ally, is Margery, a smart-talking, self-sufficient woman who's never asked a man's permission for anything. They will be joined by three other singular women who become known as the Horseback Librarians of Kentucky.

What happens to them--and to the men they love--becomes a classic drama of loyalty, justice, humanity and passion. Though they face all kinds of dangers, they're committed to their job--bringing books to people who have never had any, sharing the gift of learning that will change their lives.

Based on a true story rooted in America's past, The Giver of Stars is unparalleled in its scope. At times funny, at others heartbreaking, this is a richly rewarding novel of women's friendship, of true love, and of what happens when we reach beyond our grasp for the great beyond.

WANT TO SAVE ON TAXES? WANT TO HELP GOOD SHEPHERD AT THE SAME TIME? WIN WIN FOR ALL!

As you plan your donations to Good Shepherd, here are a couple of tax strategies that might benefit you either now or in the future...

- 1. If you are older than 70 1/2 years and you draw down your Traditional IRA Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), the amount you take will be counted as taxable income to you. However, if you give a portion of your RMD to Good Shepherd (up to \$100,000) that amount will not count as taxable income to you, which could save you money and at the same time help Good Shepherd. You would simply have the company holding your IRA send the amount you desire directly to Good Shepherd. Win-win situation for you and Good Shepherd!
- 2. The stock market has done pretty well over the last few years, so if you have appreciated stocks that you have held for longer than a year, you can direct shares to Good Shepherd and take a charitable contribution and avoid paying taxes on the capital gain of those shares. *Win-win situation for you and Good Shepherd!*
- 3. You might consider whether it makes sense for you to make two years worth of your giving to Good Shepherd in one year, as that may give you the opportunity to take a charitable deduction this year. If you are interested in that, please let us know so that we can apportion your gift for 2020 and 2021.

As with all matters involving your financial plans, it is suggested that you speak to your financial advisor since everyone's tax and financial situation is unique.


