Brothers and Sisters,

By the time you receive our spring newsletter, the Alleluia balloon will be safely tucked away into its box. It will not see the light of day until Easter morning. Over the years boxing up the “A-Word” has become a beloved tradition at Good Shepherd. I’m not sure who looks forward to it more ... the children or adults... or me!

This tradition is not something we invented at Good Shepherd. On Transfiguration Sunday (the Sunday that bridges the seasons of Epiphany and Lent), Christians throughout the centuries bid a temporary farewell to this word of praise. In 1296 Bishop William Duranti said it this way, “We part from the Alleluia as from a beloved friend, whom we embrace many times and kiss on the mouth, head, and hand before we leave him.”

I like to think of it as a kind of fast. We omit it from our liturgy. Ross is careful to pick hymns that don’t use the word and we refrain from celebrating baptisms and weddings. Our altar will be bare - no flowers - and the music will be subdued. During Lent on Wednesday evenings, we share a simple meal of soup and bread with our brothers and sisters in Christ and then we worship in the sanctuary using the “Holden Prayer Around the Cross.” During the service, you will have an opportunity to come to the front of the church, light a candle, and pray. Many of our members have found this service to be very meaningful.

We don’t do all of this because we are pretending that Jesus is crucified and dead. We know that Jesus lives - even during Lent. It is worth noting, that the Sundays in Lent are not actually counted in the forty days of Lent. These Sundays are considered “little Easters.” Yet there is a sense in which - as with Christmas decorations - we need to give things a rest. After Christmas, we put the lights, creches, and ornaments away. We know where they are and we anticipate putting them up again - at the right time. The same is true for Lent. During this season we put away the Alleluias. We know where they are and we anticipate bringing them out again - at the right time. When we put something familiar away for a season and bring it out again it is “new” again, isn’t it? Taking a rest from something gives shape and rhythm to life, to worship and to relationships - even to our relationship with God.

And so during this season of Lent, I invite you to join the saints throughout the ages by observing a holy Lent.

MARCH OUTREACH—UPPER MERION COMMUNITY CUPBOARD

The March Outreach funds will support the **Upper Merion Community Cupboard**. Founded in 2018, the **Upper Merion Area Community Cupboard (UMACC)** is open to anyone who lives within the bounds of the Upper Merion Area School District and is hungry or food insufficient. The UMACC is a collaborative and empathetic community response of our schools, municipalities, businesses, communities of faith, and caring neighbors. Our hope and goal is to strengthen our most vulnerable neighbors through food supplementation. The UMACC is located in the Valley Forge Presbyterian building (191 Town Center Road, KOP). *Checks may be made payable to Good Shepherd and placed in a pew envelope marked "Outreach."*

APRIL OUTREACH—CHRIST THE KING DEAF CHURCH

The April Outreach funds will support **Christ the King Deaf Church**. Christ the King Deaf Church is a small deaf congregation meeting at Calvary, West Chester and St. John's, Mayfair. Ten years ago they began a human services program to reach the most vulnerable people in the deaf community. This includes Sensory Support Services for the DeafBlind, classes and wraparound services for refugees/immigrants from 13 countries, support for inmates and returning citizens, classes for intellectually and developmentally disabled, and more. In 2019 they served 271 individuals and need to raise 66% of their funding to support operations and services. Their pastor, Rev. Beth Lockard, preached at a midweek Lenten service a number of years ago. *Checks may be made payable to Good Shepherd and placed in a pew envelope marked "Outreach."*

MAY OUTREACH—BABY MANNA



Each year 12,000 babies are born into poverty in southeast Pennsylvania. Many of these infants are reared by caregivers who are unable to nurse. Tragically, during the first year, many caregivers are unable to afford infant formula and resort to diluting formula with water, introducing cow's milk too early, or starting babies on solid foods prematurely. Consequences of this type of malnutrition are often devastating and permanent, affecting the babies' physical, mental and social growth. **100% of the money received from the annual Baby Manna collection is used by Philabundance to purchase infant formula and baby food.** Baby Manna raises funds to purchase infant formula and baby food for babies born into poverty in our five county Philadelphia area. *Checks may be made payable to Good Shepherd and placed in a pew envelope marked "Outreach."*

The Music Ministry of Good Shepherd

As we enter Lent, the music at Good Shepherd will take a more somber and reflective tone; allowing us to reflect and pray upon our lives as we prepare for the joy of Easter Sunday.

For our Wednesday evening services we'll be using the beautiful *Holden Prayer Around the Cross* Liturgy as a way to focus our prayers as we turn towards Holy Week. As always, there will be special musical offerings each week provided by members of Good Shepherd.

I am excited to announce that The Chancel Choir will again present a cantata over the course of Holy Week. "Worthy is the Lamb." In this season we find Jesus gathered with His closest followers in an upper room for the Passover feast as they recall the miraculous Passover of their ancestors. At this meal they are witnessing a foretelling of what in a matter of a few short hours will become a reality: Jesus will become their sacrificial Lamb. This cantata will tell the story of God's plan to deliver all people from the clutches of sin and death. The choir will present this cantata in segments; beginning on Palm Sunday, continuing on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, and concluding on Easter Sunday. So, be sure to attend all of our services during Holy Week so you won't miss any of this great story and music.

For sure...you will NOT want to miss Good Shepherd's Palm Sunday service this year! We will be presenting a drama that takes place on the Sunday of the Passion. Its purpose is to allow us as worshipers to discover our own rootedness in the drama, which is Christ's - so that the Passion Story may no longer be mere story for observance, analysis, learning or history; but rather so that it *embraces* us, *names* us and *becomes* our *own* story. This drama will have no "audience" or observers. All will be actors. We hope this will be a unique worship experience for you.

As always, if you would like to join the choir or music ministry for the Easter Season – I have music and a seat JUST FOR YOU! Come and speak with me after worship, and we'll discuss how to get you plugged in!

It's going to be a great season of meaningful music here on the hill, and as we enter Lent consider the text of hymn, "The Glory of These Forty Days" (ELW 320, verses 1 & 4)

The glory of these forty days we celebrate with songs of praise; Christ, through whom all things were made, himself has fasted and has prayed. Then grant, O God, that we may too return in fast and prayer to you. Our spirits strengthen with your grace, and give us joy to see your face.

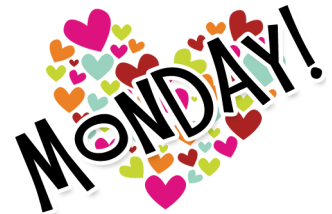

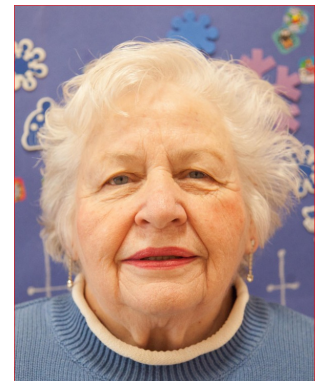

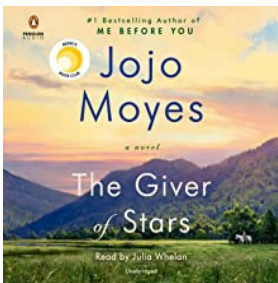

Monday, March 30, 2020 — *The Giver of Stars* by Jojo Moyes

Set in Depression-era America, a breathtaking story of five extraordinary women and their remarkable journey through the mountains of Kentucky and beyond, from the author of *Me Before You* and *The Peacock Emporium*.

Alice Wright marries handsome American Bennett Van Cleve hoping to escape her stifling life in England.
