Brothers and Sisters,

We are fast approaching the one year anniversary of the Covid-19 shutdown. The exact date that each of us will mark the anniversary will be different. Some of us will mark it as March 13th, the day President Trump declared Covid-19 a National Emergency. I know a woman who travels for a living and marks it as March 6th. It was the day that her company pulled her off the road. She hasn't traveled since. I mark it as March 12th. It was on that Thursday that I met with the choir and we decided to suspend in-person worship ... at least for a week or two. Who could have predicted what the year ahead would hold?!

Covid-19 has turned our lives upside down; from our workplaces, to our schools to our church. Each day seems to take us further into a state of unsettling unknowns. We don't know if we should make plans to travel this summer or if our children will all be back in school this coming fall or when we will be back holding in-person worship. The truth is we have very little idea of when the restrictions that we have gotten so used to will end and so, we have no choice but to learn how to dwell in the uncertainty.

And yet, in a world where so much is uncertain, there is one thing of which we can be certain and that is Christ our Lord. In a world where so much is unsure, of this we can be sure ... that Jesus, who died on the cross, lives so that we too might have life, and have it in abundance. This is our sure and certain hope.

During these uncertain times I find myself praying a prayer found in our *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* Vesper's Service. I invite you to pray it as well during these days this Lenten season.

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lent at Good Shepherd - 2021

During the Wednesdays in Lent you will experience the tradition of Vespers, or "Evening Prayer". An early name for Vespers is *lucernarium*; literally translated from Latin as "lamp-lighting time" which refers to the candles lit for the services when they were held in the early evening.

On weeks 1, 3, and 5 we will offer different versions of this sacred service: the ELW vespers service, the LBW vespers service, and the Holden Evening Prayer.

On weeks 2 and 4 we will offer a *lucernarium* for the world. We will pray for all peoples and nations of the world by using a new liturgical experience here at Good Shepherd- and we'd like you to participate!

Email the office at gskopstaff@verizon.net and use the subject line "Lenten Prayers" to let us know the names of people, situations, cities, or countries that you've read about in the paper or heard about on the news that need our prayers. They are due at noon the Monday before the service. Perhaps you'd like to pray for peace in a war-zone or for healing in a city dealing with unrest. Simply send us those details and we will offer up your prayers anonymously. When we worship, our collective prayer requests will scroll across the livestream video. We will light candles on your behalf and place them on a large map of the world as a physical representation of your prayers. It is sure to be a beautiful moment when you'll see the world illuminated with prayers.



MONDAY, MARCH 22nd The Moment of Lift: How Empowering Women Changes the World

For the last twenty years, Melinda Gates has been on a mission. 
MONDAY, APRIL 26th

Every Note Played

An accomplished concert pianist, Richard received standing ovations from audiences all over the world in awe of his rare combination of emotional resonance and flawless technique. That was eight months ago. Richard now has ALS, and his entire right arm is paralyzed. His fingers are impotent, still, devoid of possibility. The loss of his hand feels like a death, a loss of true love, a divorce—his divorce. He knows his left arm will go next.

Three years ago, Karina removed their framed wedding picture from the living room wall and hung a mirror there instead. But she still hasn't moved on. Karina is paralyzed by excuses and fear, stuck in an unfulfilling life as a piano teacher, afraid to pursue the path she abandoned as a young woman, blaming Richard and their failed marriage for all of it.

When Richard becomes increasingly paralyzed and is no longer able to live on his own, Karina becomes his reluctant caretaker. As Richard's muscles, voice, and breath fade, both he and Karina try to reconcile their past before it's too late.



MONDAY, MAY 24th This Tender Land

In the summer of 1932, on the banks of Minnesota's Gilead River, the Lincoln Indian Training School is a pitiless place where Native American children, forcibly separated from their parents, are sent to be educated. It is also home to Odie O'Banion, a lively orphan boy whose exploits constantly earn him the superintendent's wrath. Odie and his brother, Albert, are the only white faces among the hundreds of Native American children at the school.

After committing a terrible crime, Odie and Albert are forced to flee for their lives along with their best friend, Mose, a mute young man of Sioux heritage. Out of pity, they also take with them a brokenhearted little girl named Emmy. Together, they steal away in a canoe, heading for the mighty Mississippi in search for a place to call home.

Over the course of one unforgettable summer, these four orphan vagabonds journey into the unknown, crossing paths with others who are adrift, from struggling farmers and traveling faith healers to displaced families and lost souls of all kinds. With the feel of a modern classic, *This Tender Land* is an en-thralling, bighearted epic that shows how the magnificent American landscape connects us all, haunts our dreams, and makes us whole.

CAPITAL APPEAL UPDATE

As you recall, in June of 2018 Good Shepherd embarked on a Capital Appeal "Renewing God's House." Various building items were identified as targets that would/should be repaired/replaced to maintain a viable facility.

With a goal of \$400,000, the Appeal effort garnered over \$220,000 in pledges from those who returned commitment cards.

As of June of 2020, Good Shepherd has received \$136,670 from all sources, not just from documented commitments made. This equates to 61% of the pledged total, but 35% to the Goal.

Adding in Appeal funds received for the balance of 2020 we ended the calendar year with \$162,588. If anyone has specific questions regarding commitments or receipts, feel free to reach out to me. (rc.irwin@yahoo.com)


