Lent at Good Shepherd - 2022

During our Wednesday evenings this year, our preaching theme "All Creatures Great and Small" will explore some of the stories that mention animals which roam the pages of scripture.

Our liturgy for these nights will use new versions of Holden Prayer Around the Cross. On weeks 1, 3 and 5 the liturgy is titled A Heart of Flesh and offers prayers for renewal and mercy based on Ezekiel 36 and Psalm 51.

Then, on weeks 2 and 4 the liturgy is titled, For the Healing of Creation in which we'll offer prayers on behalf of the whole creation, and is based on Psalms 104 and 145. During this service we'll all approach a map of the world and will be invited to place tea lights on areas of the world (and creation) that need our prayers.

As we approach Holy Week and Easter, the Chancel Choir will be offering the cantata, "Worthy is the Lamb" in segments beginning on Palm Sunday, continuing on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday and finishing up on Easter Sunday. This cantata tells the story of God's plan to deliver all people from sin and death. The narrations remind us that He who knew no sin took on the sin and darkness of this world so that we might one day experience eternal life in a "promised land" where there is no pain or sorrow.

It's going to be a beautiful Lenten season.

Begin Your Lenten Observance at Good Shepherd on Shrove Tuesday (March 1) at 7:00pm

Traditionally, on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, Christians eat Fasnachts (donut like pastries). They do this to use up whatever sugar, fat and eggs are left in the kitchen before Lent - a season associated with simplicity and dietary restrictions.

After enjoying a Fasnacht, we will burn the palms from last palm Sunday in preparation for the following evening's Ash Wednesday service. If you have palms at home, we encourage you to bring them along and add them to the Holy Fire.

The event will take place in front of the red church doors (in the narthex, in case of inclement weather) and will last no longer than half an hour.

MONDAY, MARCH 28th The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society By Mary Ann Shaffer, Annie Barrows

"I wonder how the book got to Guernsey? Perhaps there is some sort of secret homing instinct in books that brings them to their perfect readers." January 1946: London is emerging from the shadow of the Second World War, and writer Juliet Ashton is looking for her next book subject. Who could imagine that she would find it in a letter from a man she's never met, a native of the island of Guernsey, who has come across her name written inside a book by Charles Lamb. . . .

As Juliet and her new correspondent exchange letters, Juliet is drawn into the world of this man and his friends—and what a wonderfully eccentric world it is. The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society—born as a spur-of-the-moment alibi when its members were discovered breaking curfew by the Germans occupying their island—boasts a charming, funny, deeply human cast of characters, from pig farmers to phrenologists, literature lovers all.


Juliet begins a remarkable correspondence with the society's members, learning about their island, their taste in books, and the impact the recent German occupation has had on their lives. Captivated by their stories, she sets sail for Guernsey, and what she finds will change her forever.

MONDAY, APRIL 25th The Personal Librarian by Marie Benedict, Victoria Christopher Murray

In her twenties, Belle da Costa Greene is hired by J. P. Morgan to curate a collection of rare manuscripts, books, and artwork for his newly built Pierpont Morgan Library. Belle becomes a fixture in New York City society and one of the most powerful people in the art and book world, known for her impeccable taste and shrewd negotiating for critical works as she helps create a world-class collection.

But Belle has a secret, one she must protect at all costs. She was born not Belle da Costa Greene but Belle Marion Greener. She is the daughter of Richard Greener, the first Black graduate of Harvard and a well-known advocate for equality. Belle's complexion isn't dark because of her alleged Portuguese heritage that lets her pass as white—her complexion is dark because she is African American.

The Personal Librarian tells the story of an extraordinary woman, famous for her intellect, style, and wit, and shares the lengths she must go to—for the protection of her family and her legacy—to preserve her carefully crafted white identity in the racist world in which she lives.



MONDAY, MAY 23rd The Stranger in the Lifeboat by Mitch Albom

Adrift in a raft after a deadly ship explosion, ten people struggle for survival at sea. Three days pass. Short on water, food and hope, they spot a man floating in the waves. They pull him in. "Thank the Lord we found you," a passenger says. "I am the Lord," the man whispers.

So begins Mitch Albom's most beguiling and inspiring novel yet. Albom has written of heaven in the celebrated number one bestsellers *The Five People You Meet in Heaven* and *The First Phone Call from Heaven*. Now, for the first time in his fiction, he ponders what we would do if, after crying out for divine help, God actually

appeared before us? What might the Lord look, sound and act like?

In *The Stranger in the Lifeboat*, Albom keeps us guessing until the end: Is this strange and quiet man really who he claims to be? What actually happened to cause the explosion? Are the survivors already in heaven, or are they in hell? The story is narrated by Benji, one of the passengers, who recounts the events in a notebook that is later discovered—a year later—when the empty life raft washes up on the island of Montserrat.

It falls to the island's chief inspector, Jarty LeFleur, a man battling his own demons, to solve the mystery of what really happened.

A fast-paced, compelling novel that makes you ponder your deepest beliefs, *The Stranger in the Lifeboat* suggests that answers to our prayers may be found where we least expect them.





Mary Hunter Scholarship


Established to honor her memory, this scholarship will be available to any graduating high school senior and/or Good Shepherd Seminarian that is a confirmed member of our congregation.


