Good Shepherd Friends,

Poet and novelist Robert Lewis Stevenson was frequently ill as a child. He was prone to severe respiratory infections and so, in an abundance of caution, his parents often kept him inside, away from other children. Maybe all that time alone helped fuel his imagination.

The story is told that one night his nurse spotted him with his nose pressed up against the frosty pane of his bedroom window. He refused his nurse's pleas to get back into bed. Robert stood at the window spellbound, watching a lamplighter slowly making his way through the black night, lighting each street lamp along his route. Pointing at the lamplighter, Robert turned to his nurse and said, "See; look there; there's a man poking holes in the darkness." It must have been an amazing sight to see because not only was he able to see the lamplighter light each individual lamp, he could see the trail of lights that he left behind him.

You and I are 21st century lamplighters. Each week during the season of Advent we light an additional candle on the wreath, poking holes in the darkness of the world. By the time we get to the Fourth Sunday of Advent there will be a ring of light. And then, on Christmas Eve, we will celebrate the birth of the one who shines into the darkness of this world; the one whom no darkness can overcome.

My prayer is that not only during the season of Advent, but all through the year, you are poking holes into the darkness of this world, leaving a trail of light and love wherever you go. The light of the Christ Child shines in you and it is through you, that Christ's light will shine into the lives of those who are hurting and in pain. You are a lamplighter whenever you feed the hungry, console the grieving and stand up for those who stand on the margins. Like the lamplighter, your actions speak louder than any sermon a person will ever hear.

Join your fellow lamplighters in worship during this season of Advent as together we poke holes in the darkness of our world.

OUTREACH IN DECEMBER—The December Outreach funds will support The ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission program which invites ELCA young adults ages 21-29 into a transformative, year-long journey in international service. As they offer themselves in service, ELCA young adults are shaped by the witness of our global neighbors. They share in the journeys of companion churches and organizations in one of nine countries around the world. A year of service through the Young Adults in Global Mission program invites young adults to become the hands and feet of Jesus in the world, providing critical support to ministries and projects in communities of need. It also invites volunteers into a journey of self-reflection, providing space to consider their sense of identity, God's work in the world, and their place within it all. Checks may be made payable to Good Shepherd and designated for "Outreach."

OUTREACH IN JANUARY—The January Outreach funds will support Lutheran Disaster Response. Due to the ongoing need following recent disasters such as Hurrican Ida, outreach funds for the month of January will go to support Lutheran Disaster Response. This is a service provided by the ELCA to bring hope and healing to people here in the US and around the world whose lives have been devastated by disasters. They work with other relief organizations in these hard hit areas by providing emotional and spiritual support, coordinating volunteers, assisting refugees and providing long-term recovery efforts. They will continue to be there for what comes next with our help. Checks may be made payable to Good Shepherd and designated for "Outreach."

OUTREACH IN FEBRUARY—The February Outreach funds will support Bear Creek Camp. Their mission stays the same; to help individuals explore, celebrate and grow in God's creation. Bear Creek Camp is a ministry of the Southeastern and Northeastern Pennsylvania Synods of the ELCA. Located in the beauty of the Pocono Mountains, they offer year-round opportunities, including summer residential youth camp, nature day camp, environmental education programs, weekend camp retreats and outside group rentals. Checks may be made payable to Good Shepherd and designated for 'Ontreach."

WANT TO SAVE ON TAXES? WANT TO HELP GOOD SHEPHERD AT THE SAME TIME? WIN WIN FOR ALL!

As you plan your donations to Good Shepherd, here are a couple of tax strategies that might benefit you either now or in the future...

- 1. If you are older than 72 1/2 years and you draw down your Traditional IRA Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), the amount you take will be counted as taxable income to you. However, if you give a portion of your RMD to Good Shepherd (up to \$100,000) that amount will not count as taxable income to you, which could save you money and at the same time help Good Shepherd. You would simply have the company holding your IRA send the amount you desire directly to Good Shepherd. Win-win situation for you and Good Shepherd!
- 2. The stock market has done pretty well over the last few years, so if you have appreciated stocks that you have held for longer than a year, you can direct shares to Good Shepherd and take a charitable contribution and avoid paying taxes on the capital gain of those shares. Win-win situation for you and Good Shepherd!
- 3. You might consider whether it makes sense for you to make two years worth of your giving to Good Shepherd in one year, as that may give you the opportunity to take a charitable deduction this year. If you are interested in that, please let us know so that we can apportion your gift for 2021 and 2022.

As with all matters involving your financial plans, it is suggested that you speak to your financial advisor since everyone's tax and financial situation is unique.

YEAR END REMINDERS FROM THE TREASURER

Despite the pandemic, Good Shepherd has been able to remain financially positive thanks to everyone who has continued to send in their offering via the mail and online banking. To insure proper inclusion of your gifts in the year 2021, please mail them in early enough so that we receive them before making a year-end deposit. 

This is how a family keeps a secret...and how that secret ends up keeping them.

This is how a family lives happily ever after...until happily ever after becomes complicated.

This is how children change...and then change the world.

This is Claude. He's five years old, the youngest of five brothers, and loves peanut butter sandwiches. He also loves wearing a dress, and dreams of being a princess.

When he grows up, Claude says, he wants to be a girl.

Rosie and Penn want Claude to be whoever Claude wants to be. They're just not sure they're ready to share that with the world. Soon the entire family is keeping Claude's secret. Until one day it explodes.

This Is How It Always Is is a novel about revelations, transformations, fairy tales, and family. And it's about the ways this is how it always is: Change is always hard and miraculous and hard again, parenting is always a leap into the unknown with crossed fingers and full hearts, children grow but not always according to plan. And families with secrets don't get to keep them forever.

The mesmerizing tale of a woman who must risk everything to hunt down the dangerous man who shaped her past and threatens to steal her future: her father.

Helena Pelletier has a loving husband, two beautiful daughters, and a business that fills her days. But she also has a secret: she is the product of an abduction. Her mother was kidnapped as a teenager by her father and kept in a remote cabin in the marshlands of Michigan's Upper Peninsula. Helena, born two years after the abduction, loved her home in nature, and despite her father's sometimes brutal behavior, she loved him, too...until she learned precisely how savage he could be.

More than twenty years later, she has buried her past so soundly that even her husband doesn't know the truth. But now her father has killed two guards, escaped from prison, and disappeared into the marsh. The police begin a manhunt, but Helena knows they don't stand a chance. Knows that only one person has the skills to find the survivalist the world calls the Marsh King-because only one person was ever trained by him: his daughter.


