If you are one of the many people who use social media, you might be familiar with "#Blessed." This is how I have seen it used ...

I got a new car #Blessed I got into my first choice of colleges #Blessed I am getting married #Blessed I scored two front seat tickets to Paul McCartney's "Get Back Tour" #Blessed I just got back from the best trip ever #Blessed

Needless to say, this is theologically problematic. After all, what does this say about the person who doesn't have a new car, but instead a car that seems to break down every other day? Or what about the high school senior who doesn't get into their first choice college, or their second or third? Or what about the person who hasn't found someone with whom to spend their life (or did find someone but then they left). You see how problematic it is?

Sometimes I wonder if the term blessed has lost its meaning. Maybe calling something "blessed" has become a way for people to boast while pretending to be humble.

Maybe we need to take another look at the word "blessed" and recover its actual meaning. A blessing is not something that you receive from God for a job well done. A blessing is something that God freely gives because that is who God is. We don't deserve to be blessed and we can't earn blessings. They are gifts from God.

My favorite story of blessings is found in Genesis 12:2. God said to Abraham, "I will make you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing." In other words we have been blessed so that we can go out and be a blessing to others. Our blessings do not lead to bragging but to generosity.

I hope that you will join me on Rally Day, Sunday, September 11th as we, who have been richly blessed, are a blessing to others.

To celebrate their shared century, they decide to paint their life stories: of growing old and staying young, of giving joy, of receiving kindness, of losing love, of finding the person who is everything.




THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27th Hum If You Don't Know the Words

Life under Apartheid has created a secure future for Robin Conrad, a ten-year-old white girl living with her parents in 1970s Johannesburg. In the same nation but worlds apart, Beauty Mbali, a Xhosa woman in a rural village in the Bantu homeland of the Transkei, struggles to raise her children alone after her husband's death. Both lives have been built upon the division of race, and their meeting should never have occurred...until the Soweto Uprising, in which a protest by black students ignites

racial conflict, alters the fault lines on which their society is built, and shatters their worlds when Robin's parents are left dead and Beauty's daughter goes missing.

After Robin is sent to live with her loving but irresponsible aunt, Beauty is hired to care for Robin while continuing the search for her daughter. In Beauty, Robin finds the security and family that she craves, and the two forge an inextricable bond through their deep personal losses. But Robin knows that if Beauty finds her daughter, Robin could lose her new caretaker forever, so she makes a desperate decision with devastating consequences. Her quest to make amends and find redemption is a journey of self-discovery in which she learns the harsh truths of the society that once promised her protection.
